

## Project Description

### Equestrian Campground-Toilet

This multi-phase project provides the park with the equestrian campground that was originally identified in the 1984 Master Plan. The facility would replace the current “temporary” campground consisting of 11 small, closely-spaced campsites that have no amenities and are located on a crumbling asphalt lot in the park’s busy core. Hiring Ayres and Associates of Madison, the Friends have obtained DNR approval of design plans for a 21-site campground to be built on a spacious tract of land on the peaceful north end of the park. Water and electricity are already in place.

The 2018 Project: Vault Toilet. Currently horse riders seeking to enjoy a day on Governor Dodge State Park’s 25-plus miles of horse trails park their vehicles in a grassy lot on the park’s north side, adjacent to the future campground site. Equipped with water, hitching rails and picnic tables, the lot is shared with hikers and rock climbers. The Friends seek to provide a permanent vault toilet to serve all users of this lot, as well as the future campground. The building will be a pre-cast concrete structure similar in structure and design to others recently installed at the park. It will meet ADA and building code requirements. With pleasant, safe and accessible bathroom facilities, park users and volunteers will extend their outdoor recreation time.
